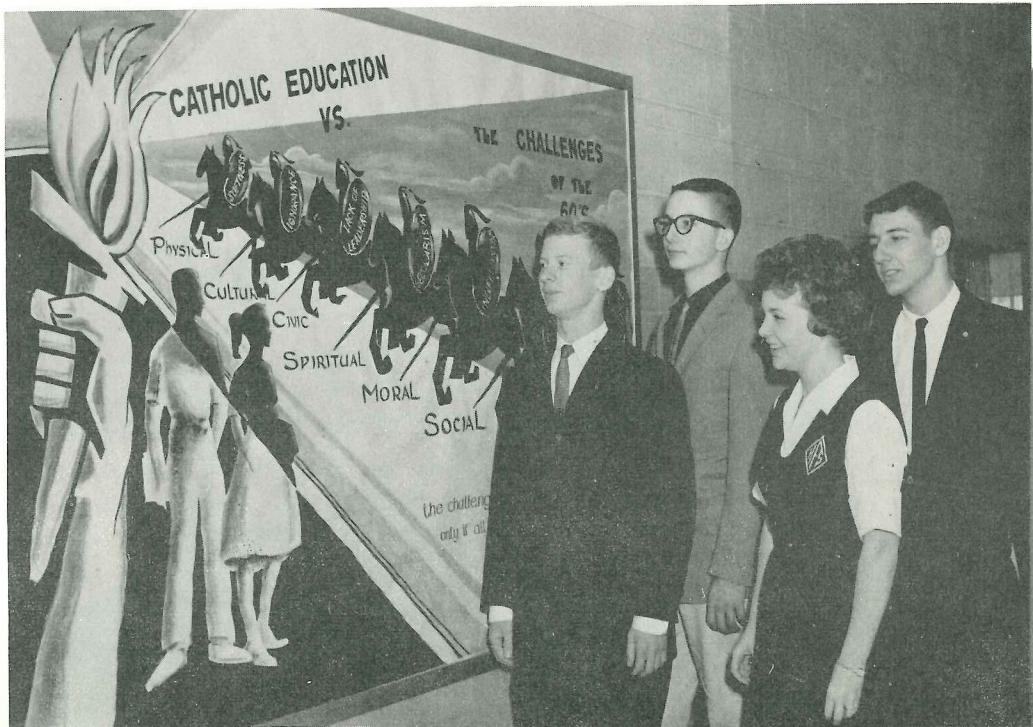


OUR LEADERS

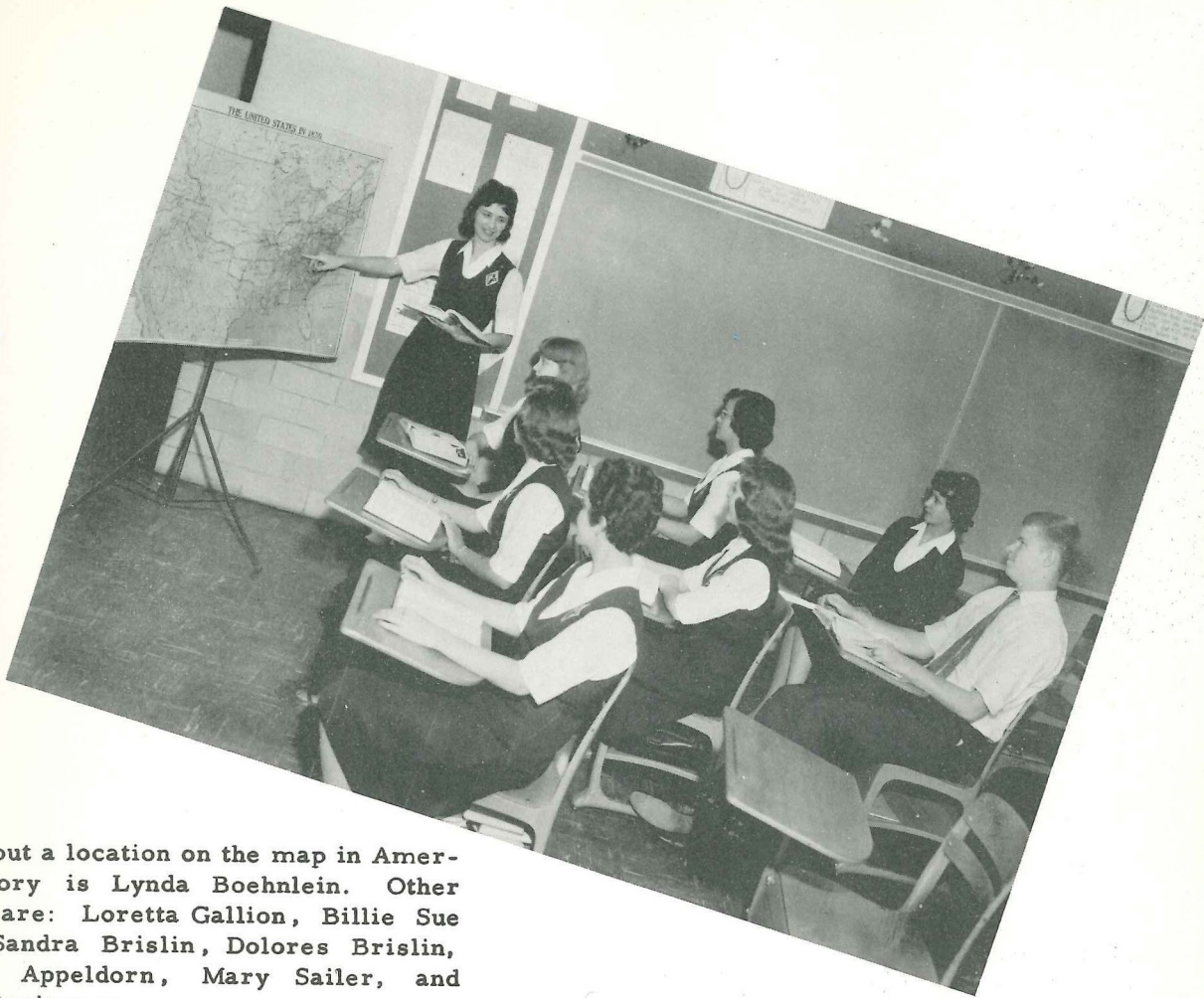

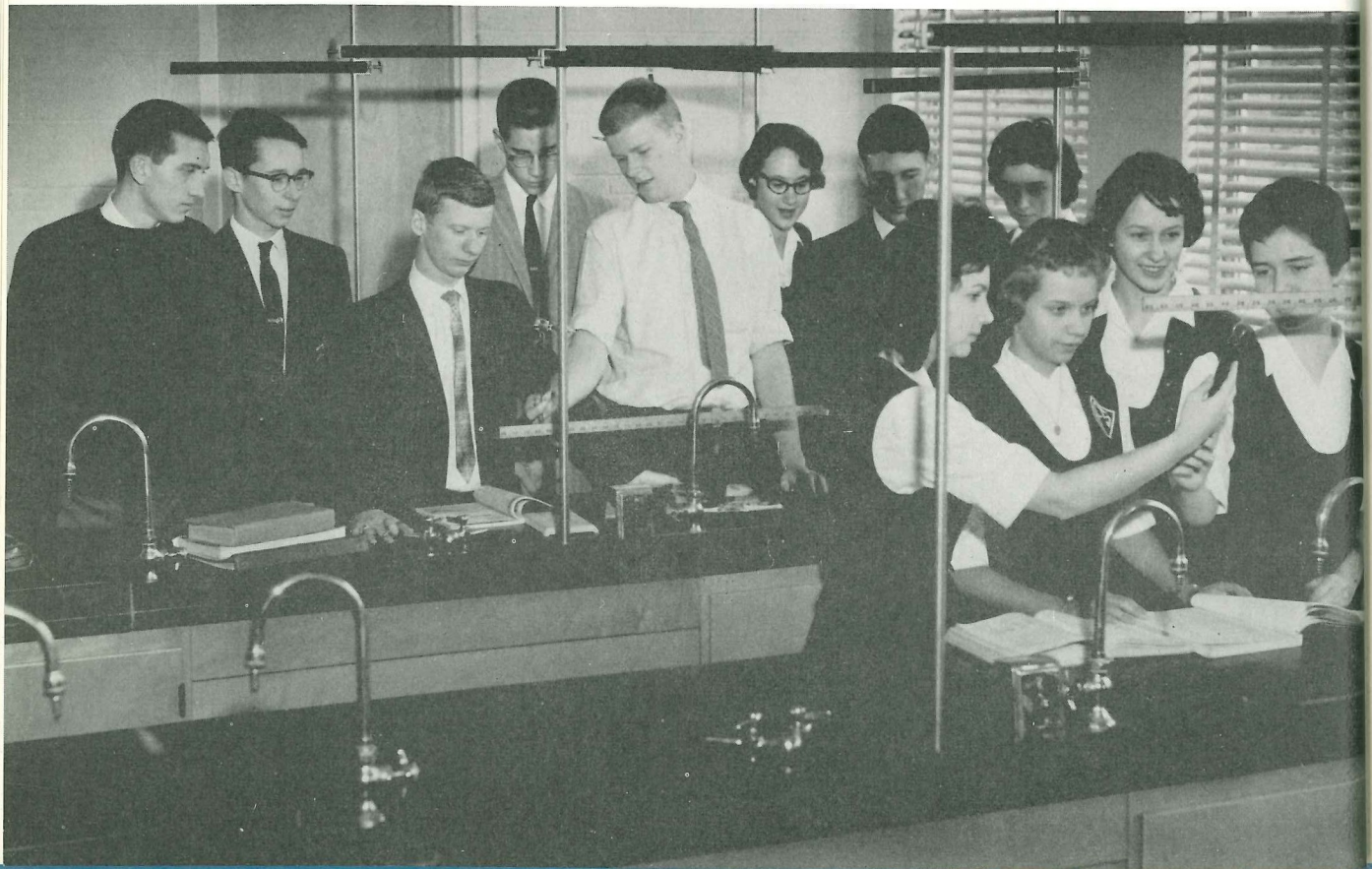

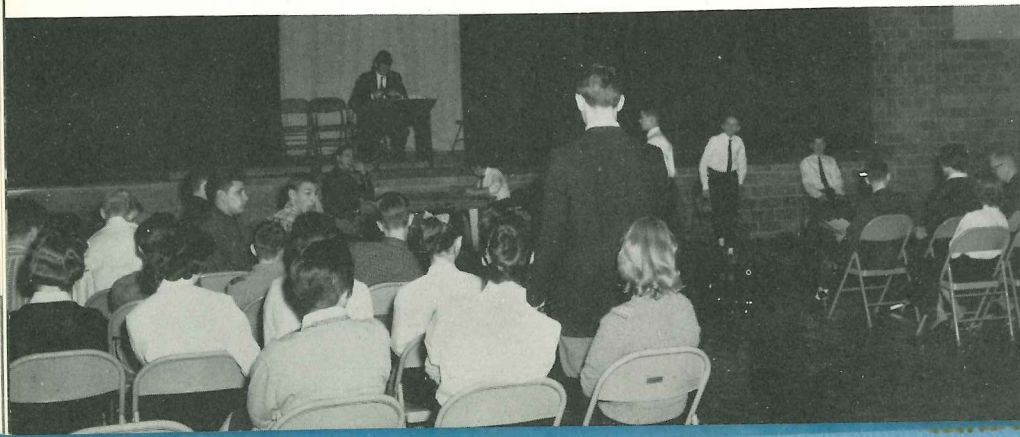

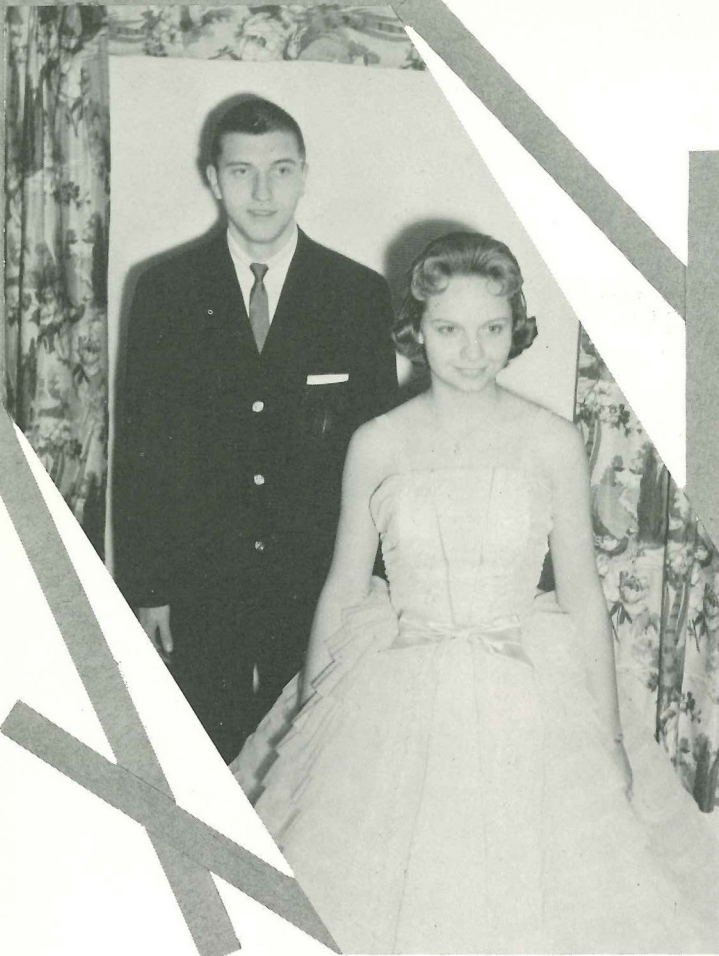

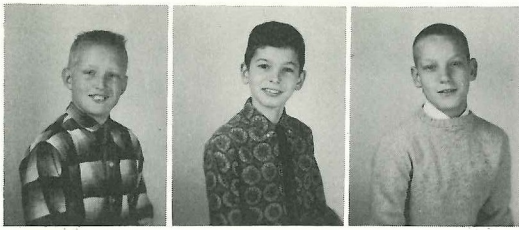

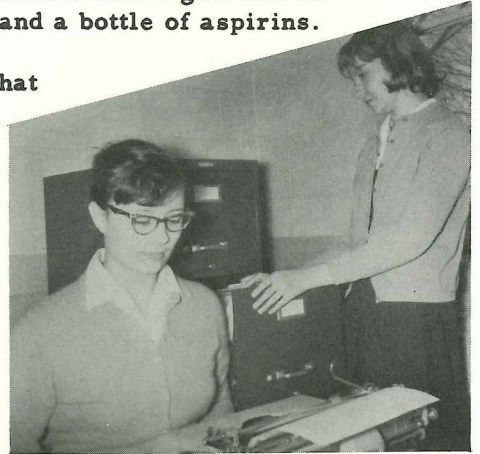
her training in Toledo she'd find her way back to good old Kentucky.

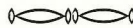

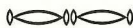

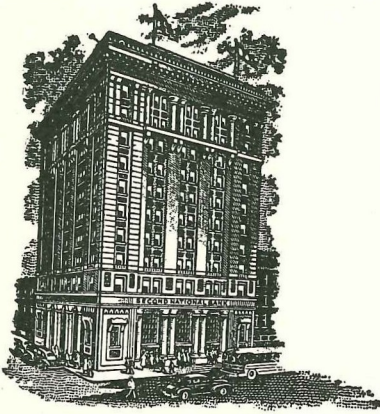
