This issue of the CARROLAN is dedicated to Mr. Joseph J. (Joe) Mele. Mr. Mele was the son of Anthony and Theresa Mele, and was born June 17, 1919 in Olean, New York. He attended St. Bonaventure School and Allegheny High School.

Mr. Mele was employed by National Gould Batteries, (Gould Inc.) at Depew, New York originally and was transferred to their Huntington, West Virginia plant in 1949. After looking the area over, at that time, he decided to live in Ashland, Kentucky. He was a member of Holy Family Parish, where he was active in many parish affairs and activities. He was a mass usher, and gave much time and assistance to the church whenever called upon.

Married, prior to his migration to Ashland, to the former Helen V. Arcese of Lancaster, New York, their union produced four daughters Mary Anne, Dahlia Anne, Helen Theresa and Barbara Ann. All of these girls are graduates of Holy Family High School.

Shortly after Mr. Mele arrived in Ashland, he became interested in the Athletic programs of Holy Family, and joined the Athletic Association. He maintained this membership until his death, at which time he was the Treasurer of the Association, having been elected to this office early in his affiliation with the group.

Mr. Mele was a member of the Ashland Council Knights of Columbus, and served as the top officer of that group, Grand Knight. He also was a member of the Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus, and served a term as leader of that patriotic organization, Faithful Navigator. During his terms as Grand Knight, Mr. Mele helped to foster programs for young people who were always dear to his heart.

It is fitting to dedicate this annual to the memory of Joe Mele, who was always ready to give his help and assistance to any of the members of our school, without complaint, without considering his own requirements; unselfishly he served us all. He was a man of high character, of good example, a man dedicated to serving his God, through his Church and his country and those creatures of God--his fellow man.

Mr. Mele died on October 10, 1970. Holy Family students who knew him remember him with great affection. His presence has been greatly missed, but we recall with much pleasure his devotion to those he loved, his dedication to those things right and good for mankind, his untiring faith in God and his beautiful association with all mankind.

We respectfully dedicate this issue of the CARROLLAN to the memory of this Christian man, Joe Mele, with the hope that his example and life will guide us to our ultimate goal, an eternity with God.

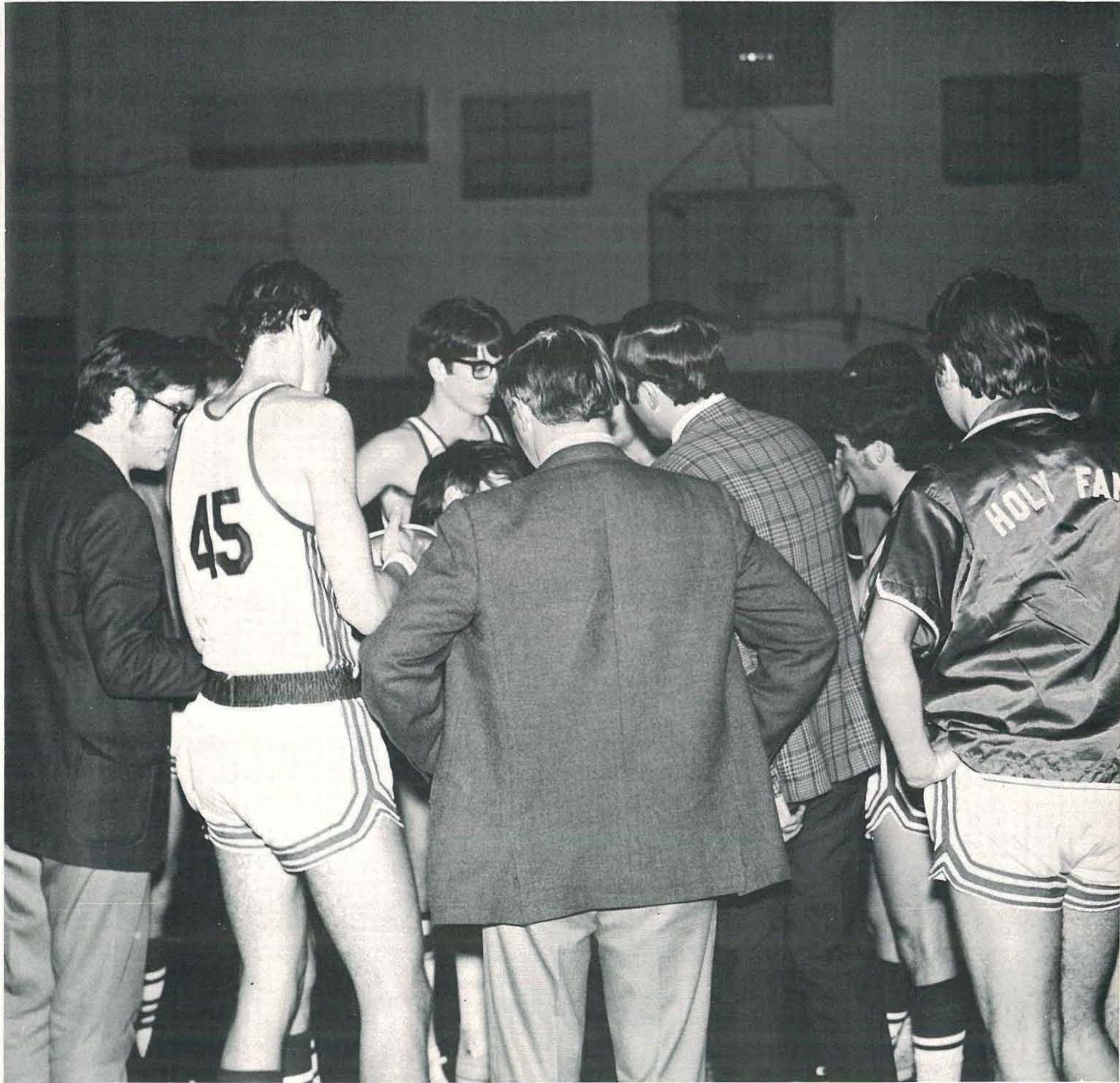
