### **Students at Floyd County**


The student body at the schools served by Floyd County is 97.3% White, 0.5% Black, 0.2% Asian or Asian/Pacific Islander, 1.2% Hispanic/Latino, 0% American Indian or Alaska Native, and 0% Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander. In addition, 0.8% of students are two or more races, and 0% have not specified their race or ethnicity.

Also, 48% of students are female, and 52% of students are male. At schools in Floyd County, 58.0% of students are eligible to participate in the federal free and reduced price meal program and 0.1% of students are English language learners.

### **Teachers at Floyd County**

Within Floyd County, 100.0% of teachers are licensed, and 85.7% have three or more years of experience. The student-to-teacher ratio is lower than the state average, at 16:1. The district has 1 full-time counselor on staff.

### **Test Scores at Floyd County**

In Floyd County, 63% of elementary students tested at or above the proficient level for reading, and 42% tested at or above that level for math. Also, 60% of middle school students tested at or above the proficient level for reading, and 39% tested at or above that level for math. And 34% of high school students tested at or above the proficient level for reading, and 21% tested at or above that level for math.


### **Finances at Floyd County**

Floyd County spends \$10,857 per student each year. It has an annual revenue of \$72,869,000. Overall, the district spends \$6,277.5 million on instruction, \$3,622.6 million on support services and \$790.6 million on other expenses.
